Although spring is slow in coming, there is much to be grateful for in this Easter season.

As I believe most of you know, Father Matthew Buterbaugh has accepted our call and plans to celebrate his first service with us on May 19th (Pentecost Sunday). In the coming weeks, he and his wife will be visiting Kenosha to bring some of their things to the Rectory and to start preparations for the big move. We do not yet have a date for the official installation, but we will be working with the Bishop's Office to coordinate that.

Fr. Buterbaugh is a native of the Midwest. He is originally from Kansas. After college, he spent a year as a missionary in Venezuela before going to seminary. Fr. Buterbaugh earned his MDiv. from Seabury-Western Theological Seminary in Evanston, IL. Since completing seminary, he has served two congregations: he was a curate at St. David's Church in Topeka, KS and most recently has been the rector of the Church of St. John the Evangelist in New Brunswick, NJ.

I would like to thank the members of the Search Committee, who dedicated many hours of their time, thought and prayer during our discernment. The committee, led by our Junior Warden Jamie Cairo, was comprised of Cary Pallin, Ken Specht, Dawn Christiansen, Jenny McCombe, Frank Summers, Jim Lochtefeld, and Guida Brown.

We are also very happy to be able to celebrate with Father Gary and Jeri on the occasion of his retirement from active ministry. Father Gary and family will be with us for a 10:00 am service on April 21st to celebrate the Eucharist. We will be hosting a luncheon in the Guild Hall after the service for the members of St. Matthew's, as well as Father Gary's larger worship family. CLUB



"Amateur sleuth Isabel Dalhousie is a philosopher who also uses her training to solve unusual mysteries. Isabel is editor of the *Review of Applied Ethics* – which addresses such questions as ‘Truth telling in sexual relationships’ – and she also hosts The Sunday Philosophy Club at her house in Edinburgh. Behind the city's Georgian facades, its moral compasses are spinning with greed, dishonesty and murderous intent. Instinct tells Isabel that the young man who tumbled to his death in front of her eyes at a concert in the Usher Hall didn't fall. He was pushed.

With Isabel Dalhousie, Alexander McCall Smith introduces a new and pneumatic female sleuth to tackle murder, mayhem – and the mysteries of life. As her hero WH Auden maintained, classic detective fiction stems from a desire for an uncorrupted Eden which the detective, as an agent of God, can return to us.
